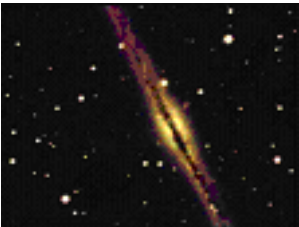
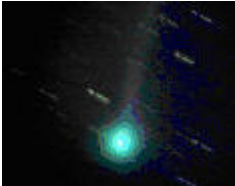

## **Welcome to Wycombe Astronomical Society**

We are a friendly society based near Amersham in Buckinghamshire. Wycombe Astronomy Society was formed in 1981 for the benefit of all living in South Buckinghamshire, interested in Astronomy. The society is for beginners as well as more advanced astronomers, all working together for a fulfilling hobby everyone can enjoy.

The Society is affiliated to The Society for Popular Astronomy and the Federation of Astronomical Societies and holds regular meetings at Woodrow High House which is situated 5 and a half miles from High Wycombe and 2 miles from Amersham just off the A404.



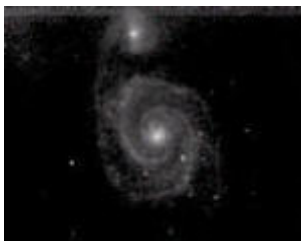
We hold regular observing sessions during most months of the year, weather permitting. Members can use the society's 10-inch Schmitt-Cassegrain telescope, housed in our observatory at Woodrow House. Other members also bring along their own telescopes and binoculars, which are freely available for others to use. Our observing season starts in August each year with a BBQ organized to coincide with the Perseid meteor shower. The society owns astronomical equipment, books, videos and magazines, which are available for members at no charge. The society also organizes day trips to places of astronomical interest.

## Calendar of events

We have two types of regular meeting every month. A lecture style meeting with a guest speaker, typically the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of each month, and a practical, observing orientated, evening on the first Thursday of each month.

### Practical Evenings

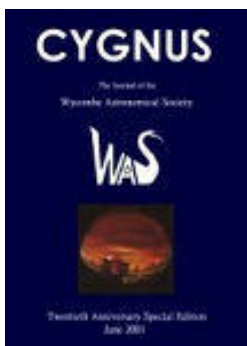
Practical astronomy evenings were introduced in 2003 to support all members keen to understand more about the wonders of the night sky.
